Then he taught us about Politics. He talked about networking for an organization to achieve changes that benefit the organization or individuals with navigating for end results.



The session aimed to provide students with practical knowledge about key management functions, effective communication, and the importance of organizational vision and strategy. The lecture also included valuable insights on aligning resources, building relationships, and achieving desired outcomes in the workplace.

The session began with an introductory speech by Harshita Srivastava (Student), who welcomed the guest speaker and highlighted his vast experience in HR and Industrial Relations (IR). She emphasized the importance of learning from experienced professionals like Dr. Mahesh Vashi to gain insights into real-world HR practices.

- ☐ Dr. Mahesh Vashi began his lecture by explaining some fundamental concepts related to communication, management, and organizations.
- Communication: Defined as the intersection between ideas, messages, and information.

He stressed the importance of effective communication in building strong relationships within organizations.

 Management: Described as a systematic way of carrying out activities in the field of human effort.



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He highlighted that effective management requires discipline, proper planning, and strategic decisionmaking.

• Company: Defined as a group of people working together to achieve a common goal.

Dr. Vashi emphasized that success comes from doing what you love and encouraged students to find a career they are passionate about.

He quoted:

"No one can succeed in work which he or she does not like so my advice to you is, find what you like doing best and get someone to pay you for doing it."

Dr. Vashi highlighted key management functions:

- 1. Utilization of available resources
- 2. Forming a Vision
- 3. Planning the strategy to realize the Vision
- 4. Leadership & Team Building
- 5. Developing Human Resource
- 6. Delegation
- 7. Motivation
- 8. Communication
- 9. Reviewing Performance
- Dr. Vashi highlighted three key management functions essential for organizational success:
- 1. Utilization of Available Resources:

He introduced a simple yet effective formula:

R1 (Resources) + R2 (Relationships) = R3 (Results)

He shared the example of the Mahabharata, where Arjuna and Duryodhana approached Lord Krishna for support during the war. Arjuna chose Krishna's guidance (leadership), while Duryodhana chose Krishna's army (resources).

This example emphasized that strong leadership combined with proper resource management leads to success.

2. Forming a Vision: Dr. Vashi emphasized the importance of having a clear vision for the organization.

He mentioned that when he first joined Colourtex, the company lacked a defined vision, which he later helped establish.

To illustrate the importance of vision, he asked the audience to recall their college's vision and read out the vision of Narmada College of Management.

3. Planning Strategy to Realize Vision: He explained that a vision alone is not enough; organizations must build a well-defined mission and strategic plans to achieve that vision.

Without clear objectives, he warned that time and energy would be wasted.

Mr Mahesh Vashi discussed three functions but because of time limit he had to end the session. He assured that he would take another lecture to complete this.

Conclusion:

Dr. Vashi concluded the session by emphasizing the importance of workplace safety stating that the employees should feel safe to perform effectively. He also advised students to learn the valuable lessons given by Lord Krishna, particularly for those aspiring to become future managers. Dr. Vashi mentioned that additional management functions would be covered in the next session.

The session concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Ms. Siya Patel who expressed gratitude on behalf of the institute to Dr. Mahesh Vashi for his valuable insights and to the organizers for arranging the enlightening lecture. The session provided valuable knowledge about HR, effective management strategies, and the importance of aligning individual and organizational goals for long-term success.

Ltd Ankleshwar GIDC). The expert sessions on global and domestic HR practices highlighted the importance of implementing best practices to drive business success. The sessions emphasized the need for organizations to prioritize employee well-being, provide opportunities for growth and development, and foster a culture of transparency and equality.



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Session 1

Vipul Sir beautifully illustrated the virtues a student should strive for, drawing from the shloka:

अल्पहारी, गृहत्यागी, विद्यार्थीपंचलक्षणं"

The shloka says to be relentless in your efforts, stay unwaveringly attentive, be alert and ready to act, embrace simplicity and discipline and prioritize learning over material comforts.

The expert lecture by Rana Sir emphasized the evolving role of HR, focusing on responsibilities, adaptability, continuous learning, compliance, and leadership. Shri Vipul Rana shared practical insights for HR professionals to align with business objectives, embrace change, and ensure commitment to drive results. Students also learnt to understand company processes and staying updated with compliance trends that are crucial for regulatory adherence. He told about the transition from managerial roles to leadership, fostering inclusivity, and making data-driven decisions using psychometric tools enhance workforce effectiveness. Further lessons include Career planning, empathy, and ethical HR practices contribute to long-term growth, while a risk-taking mindset promotes innovation. Once limited to welcome, welfare, and farewell, HR now plays a strategic role in workforce planning transformation, driving organizational success and employee well-being.

Session 2

Manthan Shri Joshi highlighted that HR professionals must be proactive. anticipate challenges, and build close relationships with employees. He emphasized the importance of courage, pure intentions, and readiness to take on responsibilities without hesitation. He stressed that belief changes lead to action changes, urging us to maintain positivity and adapt to new technologies. The orientation aimed to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the multifaceted nature of HR, emphasizing

organizational culture, leadership, and compliance. He highlighted that courage and pure intentions were fundamental in HR practices. We learned that HR professionals should be ready to take on any work without hesitation and should avoid saying no to responsibilities. A true organizational culture, according to him, was defined by diverse perspectives and inclusive participation. Networking and collaboration were also crucial aspects of HR, as we understood the importance of building meaningful professional relationships. He advised us to keep a close watch on the company's portfolio and ensure its alignment with organizational goals and objectives. The focus should be on three things: storytelling to team members, recognition and bring one to one. Both the experts shared live experiences of situations faced by them and how they solved the critical ones. There was a Q&A session at the end of the session where students cleared their doubts and gained more knowledge. Overall, the session reinforced the importance of being proactive, adaptable, and people-oriented in HR. These learnings would guide us in developing a strong HR mindset and approach in our future professional endeavours.

આજના યુવાનો ફલ્મિ સ્ટારને પોતાના આદર્શ માને છે અને તેમની શરાબ અને સગિરેટ પીવાની સુટાઇલથી અંજાઈ જઈ નકલ કરવામાં આગળ છે. પણ કહેવાય છે ને કે; "નકલમાં અકુકલ ન હોય !" તમાકુ દારૂ અને ડ્રગ્સ જેવા નશીલા પદાર્થો નો ઉપયોગ આ યુવાનો પોતાના આનંદ માટે કરી રહ્યા છે અને પોતાના મતિ્રોને પણ ટેન્શન અને સ્ટ્રેસ દૂર કરવા માટે તેનો ઉપયોગ કરવાની સલાહ આપે છે.

આજના યુવાનો સોશયિલ મીડયાિ તથા ઓટીટી પ્લેટફોર્મ પર ન જોવા જેવા વડિયોિ સીરીઝ કે ફલ્મો જુએ છે. યુવાનો પોતાનો આ મૂલ્યવાન સમય રીલ્સ બનાવવામાં અને જોવામાં વેડફે છે ; તે ટ્રેન્ડને ફ્રોલો કરવાના નામ પર અભદુર પોશાક પહેરીને દ્વઅિર્થી



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રીલ્સ, મીમ્સ બનાવે છે અને લાઈક અને કોમેન્ટ માટે સોશયિલ મીડિયા પર અપલોડ કરે છે. તાજેતરનું જ ઉદાહરણ લઈએ તો 144 વર્ષ બાદ આવેલા મહા કુંભમાં યુવાનો ફક્ત સોશયિલ મીડિયા પર અપલોડ કરવા માટે સ્નાન કરતો વર્ડીયો ઉતારે છે. કેટલાક સમાચાર સાંભળવામાં આવ્યા છે કે સ્ત્રીઓ સ્નાન કરતી હતી ત્યારે ખોટી રીતે તેમના વર્ડીયો ઉતારી તેને સોશયિલ મીડિયા પર ફરતા કરવામાં આવ્યા છે. શું આ છે આપણા ભારતીય સંસકારો અને મુલ્યો ?

સંસ્કારો અને મર્યાદાને ભૂલી જનાર આજનો યુવાન એકલતા અને ડિપ્રેશનમાં જતો રહ્યો છે, તેમની પાસે કોઈ લક્ષ્ય નથી રહ્યું ; તેમનામાં આત્મવિશ્વાસ નથી રહ્યો.

યુવાનોને આ બધા પડકારો માંથી બચાવવા માટે તેઓ સંસ્કારો અને મર્યાદાનું મહત્વ સમજે એ ખૂબ જરૂરી છે. "સંસ્કાર એટલે જીવન જીવવાની શ્રેષ્ઠ પદ્ધતિ". સંસ્કારો વ્યક્તિને સારા આચરણ માટે પ્રેરિત કરે છે, યોગ્ય વિચારો વિકસાવે છે અને મર્યાદા એ તો જીવનની શૃંખલા અને વ્યવસ્થા જાળવી રાખવાનો એક સિદ્ધાંત છે. સારા વિચારો, સારા સંસ્કાર, સારા વાંચન તથા ભક્તિ માર્ગ દ્વારા વ્યક્તિ પોતાની જીવનશૈલી સુધારી પ્રગતિના માર્ગે અગ્રેસર બને છે. કહેવાય છે ને કે વ્યક્તિ જન્મથી ભલેને કોઈપણ વર્ગ કે જાતિનો હોય, પરંતુ તે પોતાના સારા સંસ્કારો, આચરણ અને સારા કર્મોથી પોતાના શ્રેષ્ઠ ભવષ્યનું નિરૃમાણ પોતે જ કરી શકે છે.

આજના યુવાનોને જરૂર છે યોગ્ય માર્ગદર્શનની , ગુરુની તથા યોગ્ય આદર્શની કે જેમની મદદથી તેઓ આપણા સાંસ્કૃતિક મૂલ્યોને સમજી શકે તથા તેનો અમલ કરી શ્રેષ્ઠ રાષ્ટ્રનું નર્માિણ કરી શકે છે.

એક સંસ્કારવાન યુવાન એ માત્ર પોતાના જીવન માટે જ નહીં ; પણ સમગ્ર દેશના ભવષ્યિ માટે એક મજબુત પાયો બની શકે છે.

સંસ્કારી યુવાનો પ્રામાણિકતા, સદાચાર અને શિસ્તનું પાલન કરીને સમાજમાં સમાનતા અને શાંતિનું ઉદાહરણ પૂરું પાડે છે. શિક્ષિતિ અને સંસ્કારી યુવાનો દેશ માટે નવી શોધો અને વિકાસલક્ષી પ્રોજેક્ટમાં યોગદાન આપે છે. તેઓ ભારતની સંસ્કૃત અને પરંપરાઓને મજબૂત બનાવે છે. સારા નૈતિક મૂલ્યોવાળા યુવાનો ભવિષ્યમાં સારા નેતાઓ બની સામાજિક વ્યવસ્થા સુધારી શકે છે; તેઓ દેશનું નેતૃત્વ કરી શકે છે. નવી ટેકનોલોજી અને સ્ટાર્ટઅપ દ્વારા રોજગાર વધારવા અને અર્થતંત્રને મજબૂત બનાવવામાં યોગદાન આપી શકે છે.

"તમે અને હું, આપણે જ તો છીએ આ યુવાનો."

તો ચાલો, સૌ પ્રથમ શરૂઆત પોતાનાથી જ કરીએ ; સૌપ્રથમ સ્વયં માં જ સુધાર લાવીએ તો જ આપણે એક શ્રેષ્ઠ રાષ્ટ્રનું નર્માિણ કરી શકીશું.

અંતે એક નાનકડી પંક્તિ સંભળાવી હું મારી વાણીને વરાિમ આપીશ :

"સંસ્કારવાન યુવાનો છે દેશની શોભા, તેમની મહેનત બનાવે દેશને અનોખા, જ્ઞાન અને શ્રમથી જળવાય શાન, યુવાનો છે રાષ્ટ્રની સાચી ઓળખાણ, સંસ્કૃત અને પરંપરાનું રાખે માન, કરાવે ભારતનું વશ્વમાં ગૌરવ ગાન."

- 3) Our concern shouldn't be replacement, it should be evolution.
