that included the following Modules

Module — 1: Introduction to AI & ML Concepts

On January 08, 2026 Stage -workshop commenced with a graceful opening ceremony, where our respected Principal Dr. Kaushal B. Patel Sir warmly welcomed the resource person Prof. Mayur Marolia, Assistant Professor (Class-11 GES), Govt Science College-Chikhli. In Module 1 students learned Environment Setup & AI Workflow conducted by Prof. Mayur Marolia, focusing on hands-on setup of TensorFlow, Jupyter/VS Code, 1111inig and understanding the ML lifecycle.

The session laid a strong technical foundation and set the perfect tone for the upcoming advanced modules.



Module — 2: Data Handling & Preprocessing for ML



On January 9, 2026 Module 2 of the 30 Hours AI & ML Training under SARTHI Initiative was successfully conducted by Dr. Rupal Snehkunj, Assistant Professor, SRKI Institute, Sarvajanik University, Surat. It covered hands-on techniques for loading datasets, data cleaning, normalization, train—test split, feature scaling, and image pre-processing. Students learned how raw data is transformed into high-quality input for ML models, with strong emphasis on industry-ready data set preparation.

Module — 3: Machine Learning with TensorFlow

On January 10, 2026 Module 3 of the 30 Hours AI & ML Training under SARTHI Initiative was successfully conducted at NCSC. The session by Mr. Ankit Pansuriya, Founder AiMaven, Digital Valley - Sura focused on supervised learning, regression and classification models, loss functions, and model evaluation techniques. Students gained hands-on experience in building Linear and Logistic Regression models and evaluating performance using accuracy, loss, and confusion matrix.



Module - 4: Introduction to Neural Networks with Keras

On January 13, 2026 Module 4 of the 30 Hours AI & ML Training under the SARTHI Initiative was successfully conducted at Narmada College of Science & Commerce, Zadeshwar – Bharuch.

The session, was led by the Principal, Dr. Kaushal B. Patel Sir, who covered Artificial Neural Networks, Keras Sequential & Functional APIs, activation functions, and back propagation, along with hands-on ANN model building. Students gained practical experience in designing neural networks, experimenting with layers and neurons, and comparing activation functions.



Module - 5: Convolutional Neural Networks (CNN)

On January 23, 2026 Module 5 of the 30 Hours AI & ML Training under SARTHI Initiative was successfully conducted at Narmada College of Science & Commerce. The expert session by Dr. Vishvajit Bakarola, Director AMTICST – Uka Tarsadia

University, Bardoli, covered CNN architecture, convolution, pooling, padding, and feature extraction vs classification, along with an overview of LeNet, VGG & ResNet. Students gained hands-on experience in building a CNN from scratch, training it on MNIST/CIFAR-10, and visualizing filters & feature maps.

Module – 6: Model Optimization & Regularization

On January 22, 2026 Module 6 of the 30 Hours AI & ML Training under SARTHI Initiative was successfully conducted at in the conference hall of Narmada College of Science & Commerce.

The expert session by Prof. Manish Dodia Sir from Dolat - Usha College, Valsad focused on overfitting vs underfitting, and improving model performance using Dropout, Batch Normalization, learning rate tuning, and early stopping. Students learned to boost CNN accuracy with regularization, compare optimized vs non-optimized models, and analyze results using training curves.



Module - 7: Transfer Learning & Pretrained Models

On the same date, Dr. Kaushika Pal Madam from SCET - Surat, took an expert session and introduced students to transfer learning, pretrained models like MobileNet & VGG16, and the concept of fine-tuning layers for custom datasets. Students gained hands-on

experience in implementing MobileNet using Keras, fine-tuning models, and comparing results with a custom CNN.



Stage - 2: Model Deployment & Mini Project

On February 04, 2026 Stage 2 Building a Product under SARTHI Initiative was successfully conducted at Narmada College of Science & Commerce. The expert session by Prof. Bhaveshbhai R. Maheshwari, HoD - Department of Computer Science - NCSC, guided students to build a Mask Detection System from scratch and deploy it as a Windows application using Tkinter and a mobile application using Android (TFLite). Students experienced the complete journey from model development to real-world deployment, making this module truly hands-on session and industry-oriented.

An expert session on “Equity Markets, Mutual Funds, and Personal Growth” was organized by Narmada College of Management on 21st January, 2026. This event was organized for MBA (Semester – IV). The session was delivered by Mr. Manish H. Mistry, as an expert.

Mr. Manish Mistry, is a Science Graduate and Business Partner of Motilal Oswal Financial Services Ltd., and a Mutual Fund Affiliated with JM Financial Services Ltd. He has been associated with the stock market since 2004 and has been in business since November 2009.

The objective of the session was to make students aware with practical exposure to equity markets and mutual funds, bridge the gap between theory and practice, and encourage personal learning and self-study. Mr. Mistry explained the fundamentals of equity investment and mutual funds using real-time market data and current financial news, enabling students to understand actual market behavior and long-term wealth creation.

Key topics discussed included CAP and GAP valuation, growth versus qualitative

(“Gunaatmak”) growth, and the concepts of CAGR and negative CAGR. He emphasized the importance of financial discipline, patience, and continuous learning in investing.

A notable insight shared during the session was, “For personal growth, do not remove other people’s lines—stretch your own line,” highlighting the value of self-improvement over comparison. He also recommended books such as “Trendline Geystar” and “Trade Like Jesse Livermore” for deeper understanding of market psychology and discipline.

The session ended with question and answers session.

The session proved to be highly beneficial for students, enhancing their understanding of investment concepts, valuation techniques, risk–return analysis, and long-term financial planning. The panel of speakers consisted of Ms. P.P.Mokashi (Sr.Civil Judge cadre, Secretary-DLSA), Ms. Prakruti Zankar (Police Inspector-Traffic Mgmt), Dr.Manisha Shukla (Principal, MK Law College) and Adv. Dhwani Chauhan (practicing Criminal

Advocate). More than 100 students attended the session. The students got the opportunity to listen to speakers related to law enactment, education and implementation.

All the sessions were informative and noteworthy. Ms.Prakruti Zankar spoke about the importance of adhering to Traffic rules to ensure safety of oneself and others. Dr.Manisha Shukla provided a comprehensive understanding of legal aspects of sexual harassment of women at workplace. She made the students aware of what constitutes such acts which was an eye-opener for all and thus educated the students to avoid such acts when they join workforce. Adv.Dhwani Chauhan provided understanding, scope, coverage and main sections of POCSO Act. She also explained the legal procedures and explained how the community involvement can safeguard minors. Event Summary:

A guest session was organised on February 13, 2026, at Narmada College of Management, for MBA Finance and Marketing students. The session was conducted by Mr. Sameer Bhatt, Branch Manager at HDFC Bank, with the objective of guiding students on how to crack interviews at HDFC Bank and build a successful career in Home Loans and Retail Asset Management.

Mr. Bhatt provided an overview of HDFC Ltd. and HDFC Bank, highlighting their significant role in the Indian financial sector, especially in housing finance. He discussed the bank's operations, minimum deposit requirements and various products and services offered, including personal banking, wholesale banking, and small & enterprise banking.

The speaker emphasized the importance of digitalization in the banking sector and explained the concept of wilful defaulter and its impact on credit worthiness. He also

discussed HDFC Bank's various products, including banking, insurance, asset management, and education loans through HDFC. Additionally, he highlighted the role of HDB Financial Services, a Non-Banking Financial Company (NBFC) and a subsidiary of HDFC Bank.

Mr. Bhatt shared tips on placement skills, focusing on interpersonal skills, good communication skills and increasing contact with people to learn new skills and ideas. He explained the procedure of Home Loan in HDFC Bank, including eligibility criteria, required documents, verification process, and loan disbursement.

The session concluded with an interactive question-and-answer round, where students clarified their doubts regarding banking procedures and compliance measures. Mr. Bhatt explained that banks use KYC procedures, transaction monitoring systems, and regulatory guidelines to detect suspicious activities, such as money laundering. Overall, the session was highly informative and provided students with practical insights into banking operations.

He emphasized that the investment field requires strong market awareness, careful observation, and proper analysis before decision-making, including understanding concepts like bid-ask mechanisms. Financial modelling was described as a key technical skill for corporate roles.



A major focus of the session was on Risk & Control functions within organizations. He explained that companies must identify potential risks and provide practical solutions to minimize organizational losses. Effective corporate decision-making requires a balanced understanding of company policies, profitability, and their resulting local impacts. Sir also emphasized that in life true success isn't just about winning the situation; it's about winning the person and sustaining the relationship.



The speaker stressed the importance of continuous learning. He advised students to read books and newspapers to stay updated on current affairs. Communication skills, analytical thinking, eagerness to learn and curiosity were described as must-have qualities. He encouraged students to “ask first” to understand how things connect before taking action. Observation, starting from basics, and reading in detail without rushing were strongly recommended.

Sir also highlighted the practical tools and certifications beneficial for students of finance, such as advanced Excel, Direct and Indirect Taxes, also ERP systems like SAP and Oracle. He emphasized planning, prioritizing work through a proper to-do list, and

The technical team explained the complete oil refinery process, including:

- Degumming
- Neutralization
- Bleaching
- Deodorization

It was highly informative and helped us understand industrial-scale edible oil production.

Visit to Adani Mundra Port

Later, we visited Mundra Port.

Officials explained:

- Overview of Adani Mundra industrial sites
- Port management system
- Cargo handling operations
- Import and export logistics
- Container terminal operations

In the evening, we experienced a Virtual Reality (VR) Tour, where a video presentation showcased all major plants and facilities operating in Mundra. The VR experience gave us a detailed understanding of the scale and infrastructure of Adani's industrial operations.

At night, a cultural event was organized where students enthusiastically played Garba, promoting cultural unity and team bonding.

Day 2 – 27th February 2026

The day began with a Yoga Session at 6:00 AM, promoting health and mindfulness.

After breakfast, we visited:

South Basin Area

The final industrial visit was to the thermal power plant where we understood:

Mr. Pandya argued that success has been narrowly defined by wealth, status, and titles for too long. He proposed a "Balanced Scorecard" for life, which includes:

- **Mental Well-being:** The ability to remain calm under pressure.
- **Quality of Relationships:** Success is hollow if there is no one to share it with.

Physical Vitality: Health as the fundamental currency of high performance.

2. The Role of Emotional Quotient (EQ)

A significant portion of the lecture focused on how high EQ often outweighs IQ in long-term career satisfaction. Mr. Pandya highlighted:

- **Self-Regulation:** Managing triggers in a high-stress corporate environment.
- **Empathy:** Building "human-centric" leadership models that foster loyalty and innovation.

- **Resilience:** Redefining "failure" not as an end, but as a necessary data point for growth.

3. Inner Peace vs. Outer Achievement

Addressing the rising rates of burnout, the speaker emphasized that true success is the "attainment of peace while pursuing excellence." He provided practical strategies for "Emotional Mastery," such as:

- Practicing mindfulness to combat overthinking.
- Setting healthy boundaries to protect personal time.

Focusing on *process-oriented* goals rather than just *outcome-oriented* ones

The lecture concluded with an engaging Q&A session where attendees discussed the challenges of maintaining work-life balance in a competitive market. Mr. Apurva Pandya's insights left the audience with a powerful realization: True success is measured not by how much we have, but by who we become in the process.

Introduction

The Seminar featured two insightful sessions. The two speakers and their topics were as follows:

1. Dr. Margie Parikh- Professor, BK School of Professional & Management studies, Gujarat University, Ahmadabad

Dr. Parikh conducted a session on how Shukraniti, an ancient treatise on Good Governance by sage Shukracharya be integrated into Management Education. Her session focused on Tri- balance of the Dharma, Artha & Kama as mentioned in Shukraniti. She emphasized how through assignments & case lets, the students be told to relate the Tri balance.

2. Dr. Shweta A Jejurkar- Associate Professor & Head, Dept. of Sanskrit, Pali & Prakrit, Faculty of Arts, M S University of Baroda, Vadodara.

Her topic was “Integrating IKS for Curriculum Enrichment”. It focused specifically on the practical application of Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) within the modern academic framework.

Dr. Jejurkar started by explaining in detail the meaning of IKS – Indian Knowledge system, The role of Sanskrit and regional languages in the successful integration of IKS, technical concepts within Sanskrit, such as Phonetics and the computational aspects found in Panini's Astadhyayi. She also made a comparison of traditional Indian theories, like Mammata's 'Kavya Shastra' and Anandvardhan's concept of 'Dhwani', against Western literary criticism. She emphasized on exploring traditional teaching methods used in IKS and how they differ from the contemporary classroom instruction.
