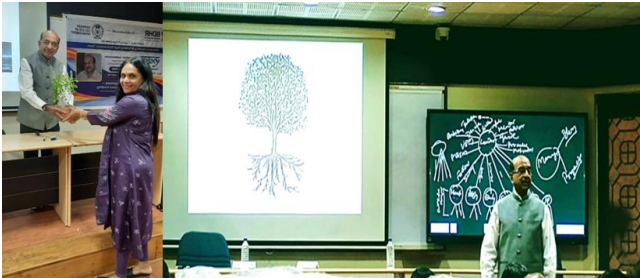

We all wish them a happy, healthy, and fulfilling new journey ahead.

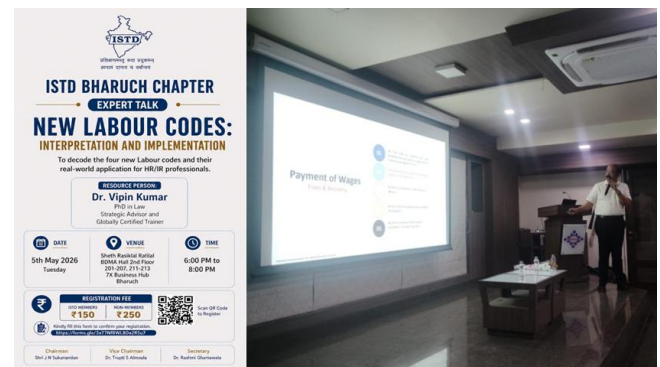
[Expert Talk on “New Labour Codes: Interpretation and Implementation”] Narmada College of Management

The Expert Talk was organized by ISTD to provide insights into the New Labour Codes and their practical implications for organizations. The objective was to help HR professionals and academicians understand the interpretation, compliance requirements, and implementation challenges of the 4 Labour Codes.

The session was held on 5th May 2026. The discussion covered the 4 new Labour Codes - Code on Wages, Industrial Relations Code,



Code on Social Security, and Occupational Safety, Health & Working Conditions Code. Key focus areas were simplification of 29 existing laws into 4 codes, digital compliance, single registration, and unified returns. Key takeaways included the need for organizations to revise HR policies, payroll structures, and employment contracts to align with the new provisions.

Special emphasis was placed on inclusion of gig workers and unorganized sector workers under social security and on strengthening occupational safety and welfare measures.

The experts also highlighted implementation challenges such as updating payroll systems, training HR teams, and ensuring timely compliance. The session concluded with an interactive Q&A gathering to clarify practical doubts. Overall, the Expert Talk was highly informative and provided valuable guidance on the practical aspects of implementing the New Labour Codes.
